what fun it is!

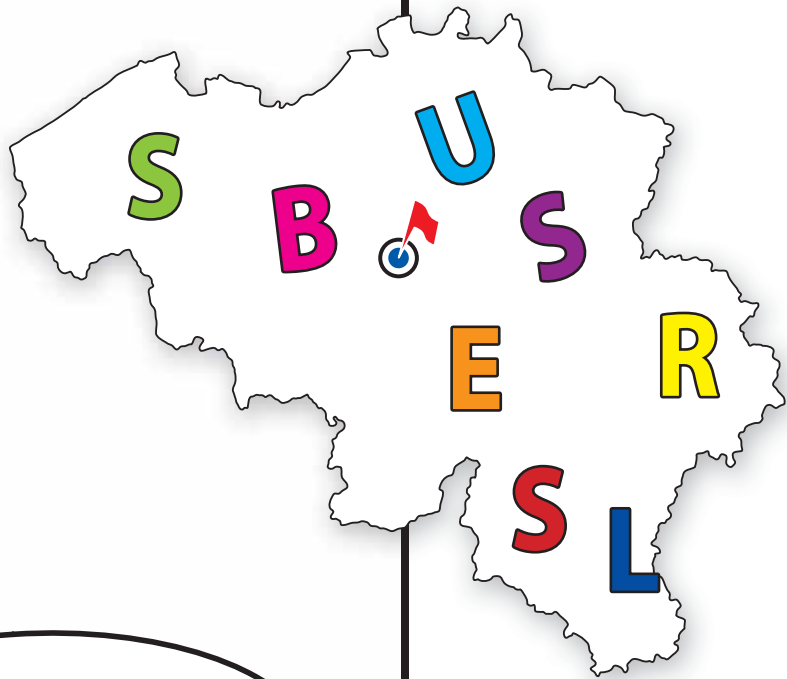
